GIN

A clear spirit flavoured with juniper and botanicals, gin evolved from a medieval herbal remedy, popularised in Britain by William of Orange, who brought ‘jenever’ from his native Netherlands when he ascended the English throne. The ‘mother’s ruin’ years of the early 18th century threatened to ruin gin’s reputation as a respectable spirit, but improved production methods and tighter regulation improved gin’s quality dramatically. Today, artisan and experimental gins are more popular than ever – and Scotland’s enterprising small distillers have proven themselves especially gifted at producing characterful spirits of exceptional quality.

VODKA

Taking its name from the Slavic word for water (‘voda’), vodka – or variants of it – emerged across the countries of northern Europe and Scandinavia (the so-called ‘vodka belt’) in the 1400s, likely originating in Poland. Blending ethanol distilled from grains or potatoes with water, it is colourless and largely flavourless – which is probably why humanity has found no better mixer drink in the last 600 years.

RUM

The quintessential drink of the Caribbean (and the navies, merchants and pirates who sailed among them), rum is generally found wherever sugarcane grows. Made by distilling the molasses produced by sugar processing and aging it in oak casks, it comes in numerous varieties, depending on the barrels used, the length of ageing and the spices and flavours added.

BLENDED WHISKY

Blended whiskies are a mixture of two or more whisky types, often combining single malts with grain whiskies to allow for a smaller price tag. Although this sometimes results in a compromise when it comes to flavour, many master blenders can create finely balanced spirits that can genuinely hold their own against a single malt.

COGNAC & ARMAGNAC

Named after the town of Cognac in France, where it is produced, Cognac is a variety of brandy pot-distilled from the juice of the trebbiano grape and aged for a minimum of two years – sometimes up to 100. Armagnac, from the French region of the same name, is made in a similar way to Cognac, and, although it is produced in much smaller quantities, is actually the older of the two spirits. In both cases, the letters VS mean the brandy has been aged for two years; VSOP indicates three; and XO, six.

LIQUEURS & EXOTICS

The volume and variety of liqueurs available is testament to mankind's ingenuity when it comes to making alcohol. Often developed as traditional herbal remedies and invented in monasteries, liqueurs are made by infusing spirits with fruits, spices, seeds, herbs and other ingredients and adding sugar syrups, resulting in a rainbow of possible flavours – from the bitter tang of Campari to the peachy sweetness of Rinquinquin.

S H E R R Y

Named after Jerez de la Frontera – one of the three towns in Andalucía that form the ‘sherry triangle’, sherry is one of the world’s oldest fortified wine varieties – once known in Britain as ‘sack’. It is usually made by fermenting palomino grapes and then supplementing the resultant wines with grape spirit. The ultimate alcohol level is what determines the sherry variety: fino and manzanilla are lighter in colour and flavour; oloroso and amontillado – both allowed to oxidise in the barrel – are darker, stronger and more complex.
